We'd like to thank you for all your excellent support with reading with the children at home. We know how tricky sometimes this can be to fit in around busy days, but the fantastic work that you do really makes a difference to the speed and quality of progress that the children make. Even as the children grow in age it is important to hear them read as well as read to them. Children need to practice their reading skills so they can build their fluency and accuracy, but also need to be immersed in language and vocabulary that is challenging and new, so that they can increase their own word dictionary and therefore develop their reading knowledge and understanding. So, don't be afraid to push the envelope and share with your children books that are tricky or above their age. It's never to early for a bit of Michael Morpogo, Roald Dahl, Enid Blyton, Cressida Cowell, Charles Dickens or JRR Tolkien. Remember also, that re-reading and re-sharing books that are family favourites and that the children love to read or hear over and over again, is very much vital as well. Through repetition and recognition, confidence is built which all helps to improve reading fluency and independence. Please see class teachers if you need any advice or guidance.
