# ART

PE

PE across the summer term will follow two strands. Firstly, the development of fitness and stamina, working towards our Sports Day. We will also be looking to develop the children's skills and team work through a range of striking and fielding games such as cricket, rounders and stoolball.



# HISTORY

Our History across this term will be focused on LEGACY and how the Ancient Greeks have influenced our lives today. This will include an exploration of the history of the Olympic games and concepts such as democracy and philosophy



The children will design, make and then evaluate a book with moving parts based upon an Ancient Greek myth.

# SHINE

This unit, entitled VIPs (Very Important Persons), will focus on relationships. Children will identify who their VIPs are within their families and friendship groups and how important kindness and respect are within these relationships. The unit addresses conflicts and resolutions in relationships.
